

Reverse Credit Transfer Form

If you are intending to do a Reverse Credit Transfer to complete an Associates of Art (AA) degree, you must **complete this form and bring it with you to orientation**. We recommend working with your community college advisor to complete this form. UNI advisors are unable to determine the specific courses needed to complete your associate's degree without this form.

****Advising note: students do NOT need to follow the UNI Liberal Arts Core requirement. The AA degree will satisfy all LAC requirements, with the exception of the Capstone and non-Western cultures course. The non-Western cultures course may be transferred in from the community college.**

What is Reverse Transfer?

Reverse Credit Transfer is a partnership between Iowa's public universities and Iowa's community colleges to facilitate the transfer of university credits back to one of Iowa's community colleges for the purpose of completing a degree, diploma or certificate. Transfer students applying to UNI need to have earned 30 or more credit hours from the Iowa community college they most recently attended prior to enrolling at UNI.

By answering the Reverse Credit Transfer questions on your application to the University of Northern Iowa, you are permitting UNI to send your transcript (at no cost to the student) to the community college.

It is the students' responsibility to have the final community college transcript, with the notation of the degree, diploma, or certificate awarded, sent to the UNI Office of Admissions. Contact UNI Admissions at 319-273-2281 or transfer@uni.edu with any questions.
