For students planning to transfer to UNI for a major in the Wilson College of Business (e.g. Accounting, Management, Supply Chain Management, Marketing, Finance, Economics, Real Estate, MIS, Business Analytics, Human Resource Management), the following plan of study is generally recommended:

1. Complete an Associate of Arts (A.A.) or Associate of Science (A.S.) degree at Des Moines Area Community College
2. Complete as many of the following courses at DMACC (as electives within the A.A./A.S. degree) as possible:

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS TO WILSON COLLEGE OF BUSINESS

1. 30 cumulative semester hours of college credit
2. C- or better in ECON 1041 - Principles of Macroeconomics
3. C- or better in the following:
 - a. ECON 2090 – Decision Analytics (pre-req STAT 1772 and MGMT 2080, or equivalents) OR
 - b. ECON 1011 – Stats for Business Analytics (pre-req of STAT 1772 or equivalent)
4. C- or better in an approved English composition course, such as ENGLISH 1005 - College Writing and Research (this would be the equivalent of Composition I & II at a community college)
5. Total or UNI cumulative GPA of at least 2.50 on all university-level courses
6. Declaration form filed with the Office for Professional Distinction (which you will do at Transfer Orientation)

NOTES FROM AN ADVISOR

1. Students must complete both an introductory stats course AND a business stats course
2. Business Teaching has a separate Plan of Study
3. Technology Management and Construction Management are housed within the Department of Applied Engineering & Technical Management (not the Wilson College of Business) – and have separate Plans of Study
