



For students planning to transfer to UNI and major in Nursing (BSN), the following plan of study is generally recommended:

- 1. Because of the sequential nature of courses in the UNI Nursing program, students are generally advised to transfer after one year at the community college. If a student does complete an Associate of Arts (A.A.) or Associate of Science (A.S.) degree, it will still take them three years to complete at UNI.
- 2. Complete ALL of the following pre-requisite nursing courses at DMACC prior to transfer:

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS FOR NURSING

- 1. Information about applying to the UNI Nursing program (and application deadlines) can be found at: nursing.uni.edu
- 2. While there is no cumulative GPA requirement for admission into the program, students must have a 3.0 cumulative GPA in the pre-requisite courses (listed above) for admission to the nursing cohort. Some exceptions can be made.

- 2. Students are not required to be an LPN or CNA prior to transferring
- 3. Prior to clinical placement, students admitted to the UNI Nursing program are required to complete/submit the following:
 - Criminal history background check and drug test
 - Proof of health insurance, immunizations, and certification of Basic Life Support (BLS) through the American Heart
 - Completion of the Department of Health & Human Services (DHS) mandatory reporter training for dependent adult and child abuse
